4.0 Introduction:

Jaramogi Oginga Odinga University of Science and Technology (JOOUST) and five Collaborating Partners secured funding from the National Research Fund to conduct Action Research titled **Promoting Awareness** and Participation of Persons with Disabilities (PWDs) in Education and Other Community Based Programmes in Siaya County, Kenya.

The Steering Committee scheduled data collection activities during the month of July 2020 for purposes of obtaining information to determine how PWDs including the gifted and talented are identified, assessed and categorized for purposes of intervention. The project also scheduled a radio talk show on a vernacular radio station with national reach to explain the progress of the report and also market the University. The talk show targeted natives of Siaya County within the County and in diaspora.
